Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Egypt today.

Giza \rightarrow 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Cairo & transfer to Giza

Included meals: dinner

Welcome to Egypt! Arrive in Cairo and transfer to Giza. This evening, enjoy an included dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Giza

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Today, your Tour Director, a professional
Egyptologist, leads a tour of Giza.

- Uncover the Pyramids of Giza, the only Wonder of the Ancient World to have survived the modern era
- Visit the enigmatic Great Sphinx, the largest monolith statue in the world
- Continue to Saqqara, the pharaohs' royal graveyard for more than 3,000 years, and enter the Imhotep Museum

Gather with your group for a welcome dinner tonight.

Day 4: Free day in Giza

Included meals: breakfast

Enjoy a full free day in Giza or add an excursion.

+ Alexandria

Nile River Cruise → 4 nights

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Luxor & cruise embarkation

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner (Please note: Some cruise departures will follow days 5–9 in reverse.)

Fly to Luxor for a guided tour of the painstakingly excavated Temples of Karnak and Luxor, once connected by an avenue of sphinxes. Later this afternoon, you'll board your cruise ship.

Day 6: Sightseeing tour of the Nile's West Rank

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner Spend the day touring the Nile's West Bank with your Tour Director as your guide.

- Explore the Valley of the Kings, a series of tombs hidden in the Theban hills
- Tour the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, devoted to one of the few female pharaohs
- View the 64-foot-high Colossi of Memnon This afternoon, sail toward Edfu.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of Temple of Horus & Kom Ombo

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner
Continue your exploration of the wonders of
Egypt on a series of shore excursions.

- Visit Edfu's Temple of Horus, an amazingly well-preserved temple and a 2,000-year-old example of the architecture of its era
- Sail to Kom Ombo to visit the Temple of Kom Ombo, built during the Greco-Roman period and noted for its twin deities, Sobek and Horus Later today, arrive in the busy market city of Aswan.

Day 8: Felucca sailboat ride

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner
Enjoy a free morning on board the ship or add an excursion.

Later, climb aboard a *felucca*, a traditional sailboat, to ride past Elephantine Island. Home to the frontier fortress of Egypt, the island is named for the dark granite rocks that resemble a herd of elephants bathing in the river. You'll take in panoramic views of the water from the hilltop mausoleum of Agha Khan.

Please note: Depending on flight schedules, the Abu Simbel optional excursion may be offered on day 9 instead of day 8.

Aswan \rightarrow 1 night

Day 9: Disembarkation & sightseeing tour of Aswan

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Your cruise ends this morning in Aswan, where
you'll visit the Aswan High Dam, one of the
crowning achievements of modern Egypt. Then,
your Tour Director will introduce you to the
temples at Philae.

After dinner with the group, enjoy a free evening in Aswan or add an excursion.

Cairo \rightarrow 3 nights

Day 10: Flight to Cairo

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Enjoy a free morning in Aswan or add an
excursion.

This afternoon, fly to Cairo and transfer to your hotel.

+ Nubian Village Visit

Day 11: Sightseeing tour of Cairo

Included meals: breakfast, lunch, dinner
Explore Cairo on a sightseeing tour lead by your
Tour Director.

- View a number of the city's 500 mosques, which display some of the finest examples of Islamic architecture in the world
- Visit the citadel that was built in the 12th century by mighty Salah el-Din and originally used as a fortress before it became the residence of the Sultans until 1850
- Stop at Mohammed Ali Mosque, also known as the Alabaster Mosque
- Enter the Museum of Egyptian Antiquities, which houses the famous masks of Tutankhamen Celebrate your trip with your fellow travelers at tonight's farewell dinner.

Day 12: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport to board your flight home. If you are continuing your tour in Jordan, fly to Amman today.

+ Jordan extension

Since July 1994, when Jordan's King Hussein and the Israeli prime minister Yitzhak Rabin signed a declaration ending the animosity between their two countries, Jordan has opened its doors to the west. Encompassing sweeping verdant and arid landscapes and relics of some of the world's oldest civilizations, Jordan is one of the warmest and most welcoming countries on earth.

 $\textbf{Petra} \rightarrow 2 \text{ nights}$

Day 12: Flight to Jordan

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Fly to Amman this morning and transfer to Petra to settle in to your hotel. This evening, enjoy a home-hosted dinner with a local Jordanian family.

- Talk with the family to learn about the local culture
- Try local specialties such as a famous rice dish called *maqluba*, a traditional style of chicken known as *musakhan*, and *mansaf*, the national dish of Jordan

Day 13: Sightseeing tour of Petra

Included meals: breakfast

Discover Petra, a city lost to the outside world for centuries. Carved into the red rocks of Mount Hor, Petra has fascinated visitors since its rediscovery in 1812.

Please note: In order to enter Petra, customers should be able to walk two miles round-trip in hot weather. Other modes of transportation may be available for you to book upon your arrival. Spend a free evening in Petra or add an excursion.

+ Traditional Jordan: Bedouin Camp Visit & Dinner

Amman \rightarrow 1 night

Day 14: Amman via Madaba & Mount Nebo

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Today, further explore the history and culture of Jordan on guided tours before continuing on to Amman, the capital city.

- Visit Madaba to tour the City of Mosaics and visit St. George's Church
- Stop at Mount Nebo, Moses' burial site, and Wadi Mujib

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 15: Sightseeing tour of Amman, the Dead Sea & departure

Included meals: breakfast, lunch
Spend your last day in Jordan getting to know
the city of Amman and relaxing in the
therapeutic waters of the Dead Sea.

- Take a guided tour of the Jordanian capital, entering the citadel and Roman theater
- Travel to the Dead Sea for time to float in the salty water and share a farewell lunch with your fellow travelers

Later, return to Amman to board your late-night flight home.

Day 16: Travel day

Arrive home after your overnight flight.

Day 4: Alexandria

\$125/\$135* (12 hours, departs in the morning with lunch)

Travel to Egypt's second-largest city, where you'll explore the Bibliotheca Alexandrina, the modern successor to the famous Library of Alexandria that was destroyed centuries ago. Here, you'll enjoy a brief tour with the curator. You'll also visit the Catacombs of Kom el-Shoqafa, Egypt's largest known Roman funerary complex, and the recently excavated Roman amphitheatre. Lunch is included. Please note: This optional is weather-dependent.

Day 8: Abu Simbel

\$369 (6 hours, departs in the morning)
Fly from Aswan to Abu Simbel, where you'll visit the temples of Ramses II and his wife Nefertari, relocated block by block to the shores of Lake Nasser after the construction of the Aswan High Dam. The temples' statues now stand 680 feet from their original site and 200 feet higher, but their original grandeur endures. Please note: This excursion involves extensive walking on rugged terrain, so sturdy footwear is advised. Headwear and extra sunscreen are also recommended. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 70 days prior to departure.

Day 9: Philae by Night

\$55/\$65* (2.5 hours, departs in the evening)

After sunset, the area around Philae is cleared for the Sound and Light Show. Watch a performance of synchronized light and music amid the ancient monuments of Egypt. Seeing these ancient temples lit up at night will create memories to last a lifetime. Please note: Travelers are advised to bring a flashlight and comfortable shoes. Also, this excursion involves walking on uneven terrain.

Day 10: Nubian Village Visit

\$59/\$69* (3 hours, departs in the afternoon)
Board a motorboat in Aswan and cruise down the Nile
to a Nubian village located near Soheil Island and the
Aswan Dam. Along the way, pass by the First Cataract
of Aswan, comprised of picturesque shallow rapids
flowing through the Nile. Once on land, you'll meet up
with your Nubian guide at the Animalia Nubian
Museum, his family home turned museum. Here you'll
learn about Nubian history and traditions while
surrounded by local flora and fauna. After touring the
home turned museum, head up to the roof and enjoy
tea while you soak in the panoramic views of the
surrounding area.

Extension excursion options

Day 13: Traditional Jordan: Bedouin Camp Visit & Dinner

65/75* (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Tonight, you'll head into the desert to meet with a group of local Bedouins and enjoy a traditional dinner at their camp. The Bedouins, meaning desert dwellers, are an ethnic group largely regarded as the Jordan's first inhabitants. Sit down to enjoy tea, appetizers, and dinner. You'll try traditional foods including Zarb, a barbeque-style dish that's cooked in a pot underground, and chicken with a local style of rice called freekah. For dessert, fried sweets such as Awamat and Asabe Zainab may be served. Throughout the evening, you'll hear Jordanian music and have the opportunity to interact with the local Bedouins to learn about their traditions, clothing, language, and lifestyle. Please note: No alcoholic beverages will be served in accordance with Bedouin traditions.
